

NOTICE OF MOTION

The following Notice of Motion is submitted to the BOABC membership for consideration in compliance with Part 8 Amendment of the BOABC Bylaws.

Existing Bylaw Provision:

Part 2, Section 6, Annual Dues

[1] The annual dues shall be as follows {amended 24/04/07}

[c] Associate Two and Three Members

Two Hundred [\$200.00] for each year of membership

Proposed Bylaw Amendment:

[1] The annual dues shall be as follows {amended 27/04/10}

[c] Associate Two and Three Members

Two hundred seventy-five [\$275.00] for membership starting April 2011.

Three hundred fifty [\$350.00] for membership starting April 2012.

Four hundred twenty-five [\$425.00] for membership starting April 2013.

Purpose of the Motion:

The purpose of the Bylaw amendment is to increase the Membership dues for Associate Two and Associate Three members by \$75.00 per year for 2011, 2012, and 2013 fiscal years. The Executive Committee endorsed the Bylaw amendment to increase Associate Two and Three dues on January 23rd, 2010. The dues increase conforms to the level of increase for Regular and Associate One members, \$75.00 per year over a three-year period starting April 2010, which was approved at a Special AGM, held on November 26th, 2009. The increase in dues of \$75.00 for Associate Two and Three members would take effect on April 2011, April 2012 and April 2013.

The BOABC has eight Categories of membership: Regular, Associate One, Associate Two, Associate Three, Retired, Honorary, Life and Student Members. Only Regular and Associate One members are eligible to apply for Certification, to vote at an Annual and/or Special General Meeting and to hold elected office on the Executive Committee. As of February 2010, the BOABC enrolled seventy-seven [77] Associate Two and one [1] Associate Three members.

By definition, Associate Two membership in the Association shall be open to employees, officers and members of companies, professional organizations, trade associations and other persons in positions allied to the building industry who provide satisfactory evidence to the Registrar. Associate Three membership in the Association shall be open to a person employed in a federal, provincial, territorial or a local government service in Canada, actively involved in the development or administration of building regulations, who is not eligible for membership under the Regular, Associate One or Two categories, who provides satisfactory evidence of eligibility, and who the Registrar considers will contribute to the betterment of the Association in matters related to building regulation.

To repeal or amend a BOABC Bylaw, it must be approved by 75% of the eligible members who are present at the Annual General Meeting and vote.
