TITLE: EXAMINATION ENTITLEMENT 7.1

POLICY:

Any Member of the Association in good standing, shall be entitled to write an Association examination at an authorized testing facility via a computer based examination in accordance with the provisions as indicated in the BOABC Examination Information Bulletin, or an alternate approved examination sitting in accordance with the following:

- Any Regular, Associate, or Retired Member may write any Level One, Level Two and Level Three
 Examination, in sequential order from Level One to Level Three, only after passing the previous
 level examination.
- A Student Member, who is enrolled in a Level One course of study in a college, university or other educational organization, approved by the Association, may write a Level One examination.

Persons who are currently certified shall not retest in any category in which they are currently certified. Individuals who violate this requirement shall be subject to disciplinary action by the Executive Committee

Suspension or revocation from writing examinations shall be considered for the following ethics violations, as determined by action of the BOABC Executive Committee, and shall follow the complaint resolution process:

- Falsifying score reports or ICC/BOABC documents
- Conviction on charges related to professional ethics
- Compromising the security of ICC/BOABC's examinations through release of copyrighted examination items
- Other Code of Ethics violations, which are documented and deemed proven

Public information about the examination program, testing requirements, and standardized testing information shall be posted by the BOABC and available to the general public without cost, at: www.boabc.org

POLICY OBJECTIVE:

Facilitates the desire of Members to write examinations in pursuit of certification recognition.

POLICY JUSTIFICATION:

There is no requirement for years of experience needed as a code practionner, prior to writing an Association examination at any level.
